The following may help you pull at the right time:

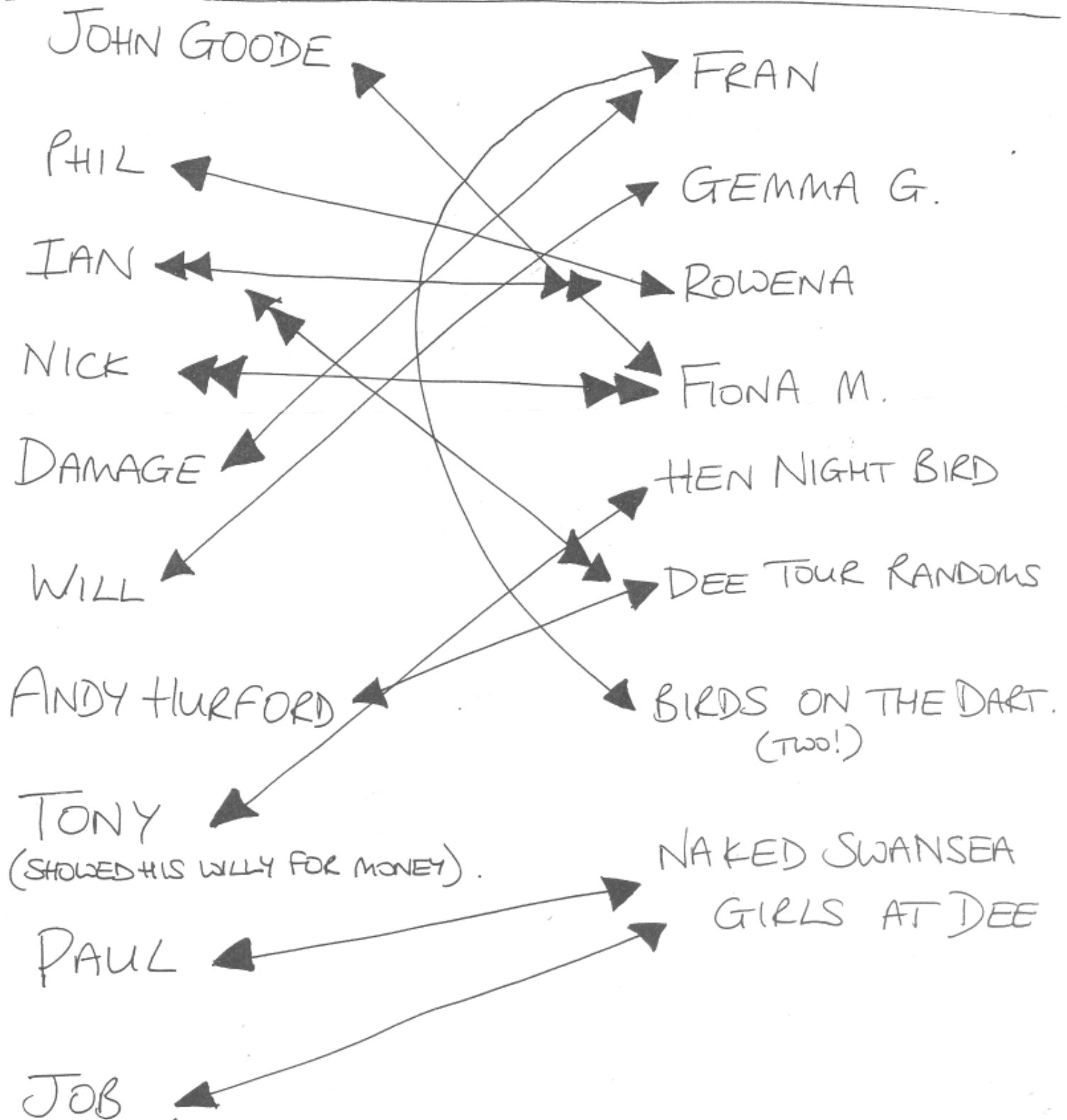
a) Don't try too hard.
